

UNFICYP'S ARMY AIR CORPS FLIGHT IS 10 YEARS OLD

The UNFICYP Flight Army Air Corps had its tenth birthday eleven days ago. It was formed on 1 August 1966 on the disbandment of 4 Air OP Troop Royal Artillery. Since its formation the Flight has operated four 270 hp super-charged Sioux AH Mk 1 helicopters.

The Flight, which is the Army element of UNFICYP's air support, specialises in observation, and air liaison tasks. It is also capable of casualty evacuation and resupply missions.

There are 19 members of the Flight of whom 5 are pilots, 7 are REME aircraft technicians and 7 are drivers and ground support personnel.



NEW CO SAVES SWIMMER



While swimming off a public beach at Paphos on 29 July Lieutenant Colonel JEL Gollner heard a cry of alarm from a civilian swimmer in difficulties about 40 yards from the shore. Not without difficulty Colonel Gollner made his way over to this swimmer, and found that the individual was being pounded by the heavy surf and was in great difficulty. Colonel Gollner began at once to get the man to the shore, a difficult task in view of the sea and surf conditions. As he approached the shore with the virtually unconscious man two other men came to help him complete the rescue. Lieutenant Colonel Gollner has only recently been promoted and yesterday evening took over command of The Second Battalion Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, and responsibility for Sector 4.




ENGLISH SUMMARY



SWEDCON ARE TENNIS CHAMPIONS FOR 1976




The doubles champions Capt Ewers and Pte Nulin in winning form.

Bad Luck struck the Auscon Tennis Team when two players were injured.


Major Oezelt seen above before and after the competition. Capt Bauer suffered from knee injuries too.
