

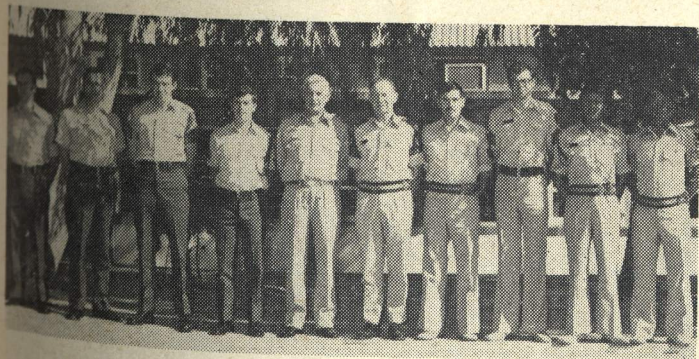

THE FISH ARE BACK HOME

The new Goldfish tent camp outside Camp Victoria is finally worthy of its name. The pride of the former Goldfish Camp in Famagusta — the fish — have been safely brought to Larnaca to give point to the name of the dry and dusty tented camp. They are getting along fine in their temporary pond and when the company moves to a permanent camp East of Nicosia they will come along too.

Great improvements have been made in the temporary camp, which now has almost all the facilities the main camp can offer — showers, mess and even a sauna, though not working yet due to a lack of electricity. The only problem is the powder-like dust, that penetrates the tents and keeps the men busy cleaning. All around the new sector five the Swedes are improving the OPs and building new ones. In Pyroi the former Canadian camp has been re-opened by men from 1 Company in Louroujina. Lt. Gunnar Björnberg, deputy platoon leader, stated that early in December the house will be ready to move into and will then be one of our best OPs.

OP S55, on the Larnaca—Nicosia road is in a brand new house, and is very much appreciated by the soldiers, after the tent they had been living in had been invaded by thousands of beetles during the past few weeks.

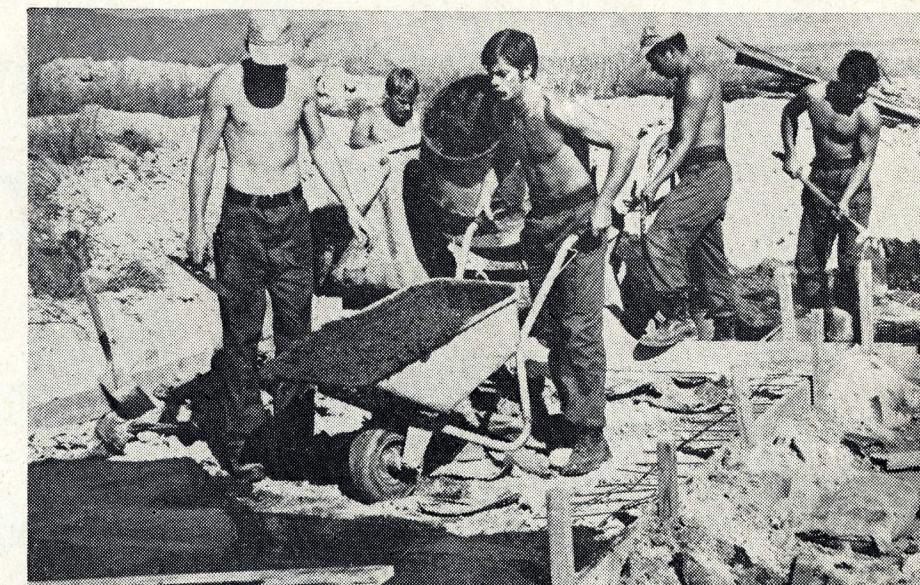

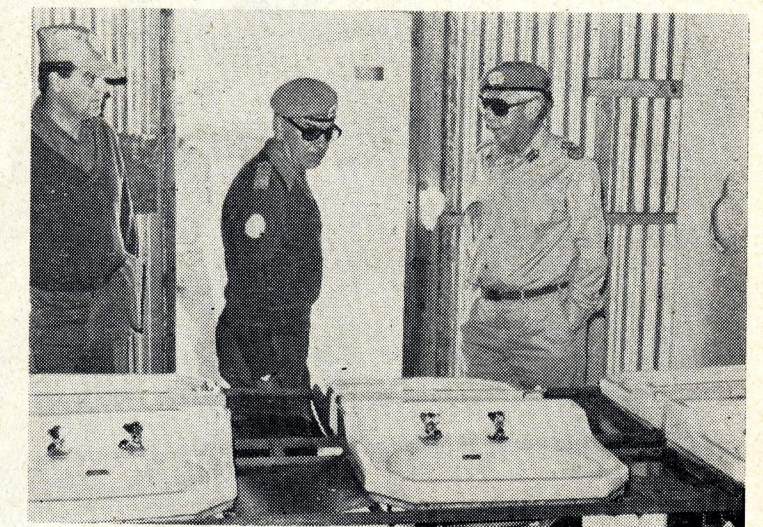

LEST WE FORGET

On the 11th of November Remembrance Day Services were held at Wolseley Barracks, Nicosia. Each year Canadians in the Eleventh hour of the Eleventh day in the Eleventh Month remember those who gave their lives in service to their country in both World Wars and United Nations duty.

2 RCR formed up outside of the Ledra Palace Hotel and marched over to the Canadian Cenotaph in the Wolseley Barracks Complex with the Unit's Pipes and Drums playing. Services were carried out by the Unit's Chaplains Capt W. MacLennan (Protestant) and Capt C.R. Finlan (Roman Catholic). The Service was brief with reading from the New Testament by the Commanding Officer of 2 RCR Lieutenant Colonel J.R. MacPherson and the Regimental Sergeant Major Chief Warrant Officer H. Clark. A list of those Canadians who gave their lives in the "Service of Peace" in Cyprus was read during the Services. Wreaths were laid by Colonel C.V. Carlson, Lieutenant Colonel J. R. MacPherson and a wreath was laid by Major Gunton on behalf of the British Contingent. After the services all ranks met for a buffet lunch in the Junior Ranks mess of the Ledra Palace.

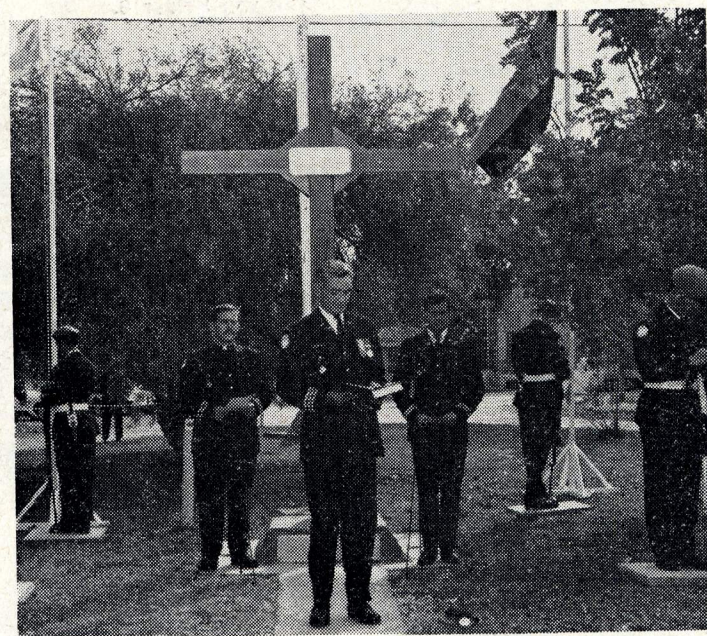

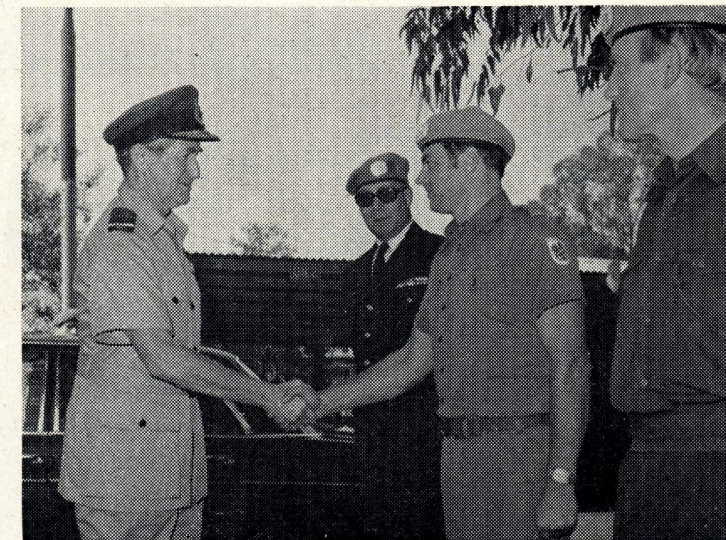

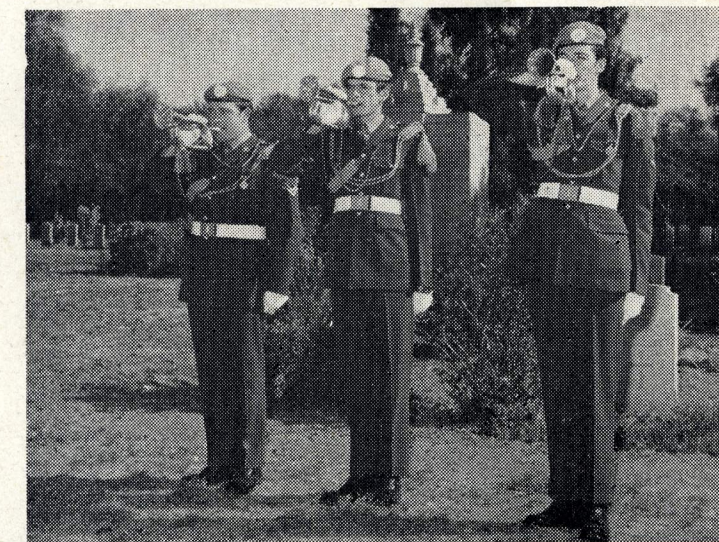
the Force Commander, and then inspected an International Guard of Honour, after which he met the principal military staff officers before being briefed by the Chief of Staff.

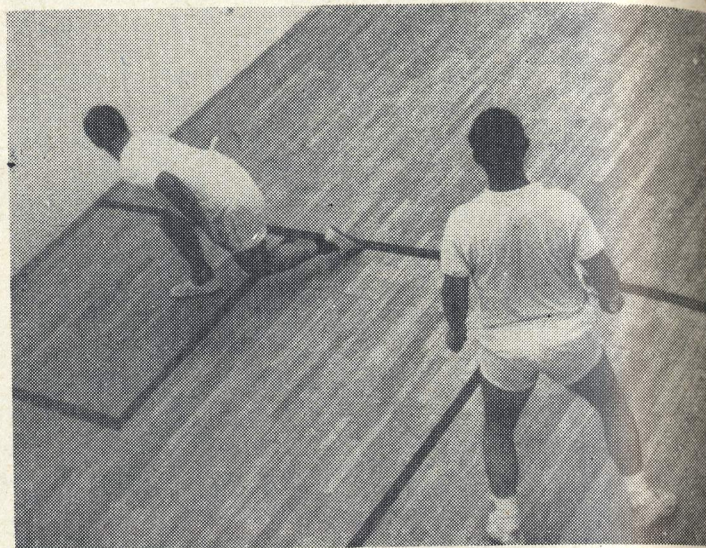
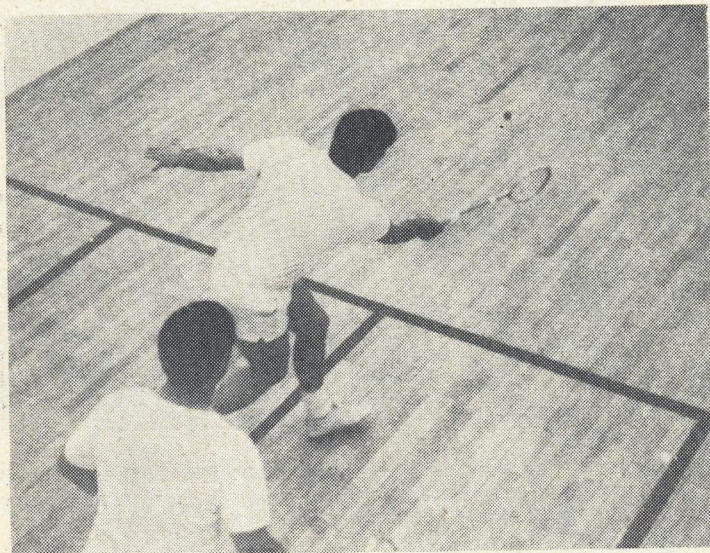

Major Harries playing Sergeant Jeffrey.

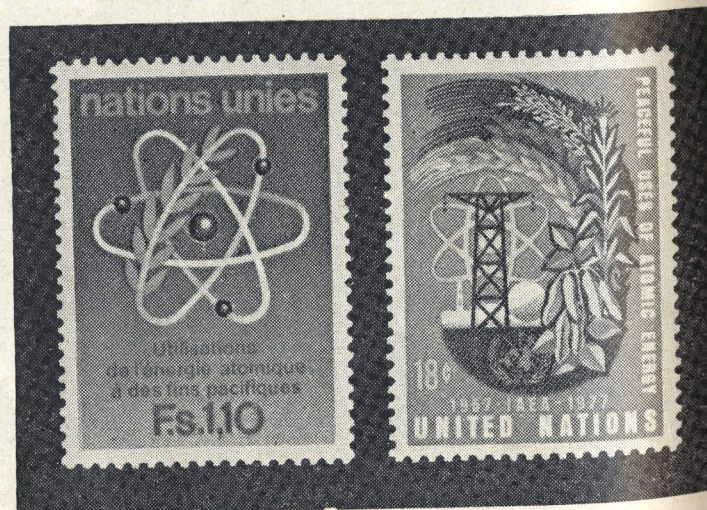
